IRVINE, CA—March 1, 2012--The Concordia University Center for Public Policy will host a one-day program featuring Harvard Kennedy School of Government Professor Dr. Bob Behn. He will focus on “Creating High Performance Government in Orange County and Beyond.” The program, to be held March 30th, is designed to equip elected officials, public and private sector managers, students and community leaders to identify and quantify strategies that improve government performance and create greater accountability to taxpayers.

“Dr. Behn is an internationally known expert on government performance. He will provide real-world, practical information that will enable all participants to immediately begin to make a difference for their organizations,” said Center Director, Keith Curry. “Dr. Behn’s program at Harvard draws students from governmental organizations throughout the world. I think the participants will thoroughly enjoy the opportunity to be part of a Harvard classroom experience right here in Orange County.”
