10 Tips to Succeed in an Online Program

- 1. Manage your time. Make arrangements for other responsibilities, make note of major assignments, and check in regularly throughout the term.
- 2. Communicate. Stay in contact with your professors and academic advisors, reach out to your fellow classmates with questions and concerns, and keep your family and friends in the loop about school.
- 3. Stay organized. Set reminders to check discussion boards, keep your digital and physical space in order, and minimize distractions by only keeping relevant browsers open while working.
- 4. Create a productive learning environment. Keep your space organized, create folders to organize digital documents, and have snacks and water on hand.
- 5. Use your peers as a resource. Reach out to your fellow classmates when you have a question and be willing to reciprocate when they have questions in return.
- 6. Work ahead. Take advantage of having knowledge of assignments in advance and knock out things before they are due.
- 7. Use Concordia's online resources. Use the library and research tools, Writing Studio, Grammarly, and CUI IT Knowledge Base.
- 8. Establish a rhythm that works for you (i.e. when to read, when to post, review, and respond to discussion boards, when to work on assignments, when to complete assignments, etc).
- 9. Apply what you are learning outside the classroom and look for real-life examples.
- 10. Share what you are learning with others outside of school. Explaining what you're learning to someone else is an effective learning strategy.

A: I think it would be fun to live in Kauai for a short time.




