**General Education Transfer Articulation Agreement**

The CUI General Education (GE) requirements do not have to be completed prior to transfer. CUI does, however, accept the following in place of all of the CUI GE requirements **except** the Q&I Core and Theology course requirements:

- IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum)
- CSU (California State University General Education Breadth Requirements)
- ADT (Associate Degree for Transfer)
- AA/AS (Associate of Arts/Science degrees which meet the CSU General Education Breadth Requirement)

Students who plan to enter CUI without completing an ADT, CSU, IGETC or AA/AS with CSU Breadth may take the courses below as noted to satisfy course-for-course alignment towards GE requirements. To be considered for transfer, courses must be completed with a grade of C- or better. View a complete list of Q&I Core requirements here:

**\*\*NOTE: Students must take at least 1 Social Science course (ANT, ECO, PSY, SOC, COM 216 or COM 324) in answering the question, "How Shall I Live?" or the question, "Who Am I and Who Are They?"**

***Students are strongly encouraged to review major requirements prior to selecting GE courses to identify courses that may apply to both GE and major prerequisites/requirements.***
